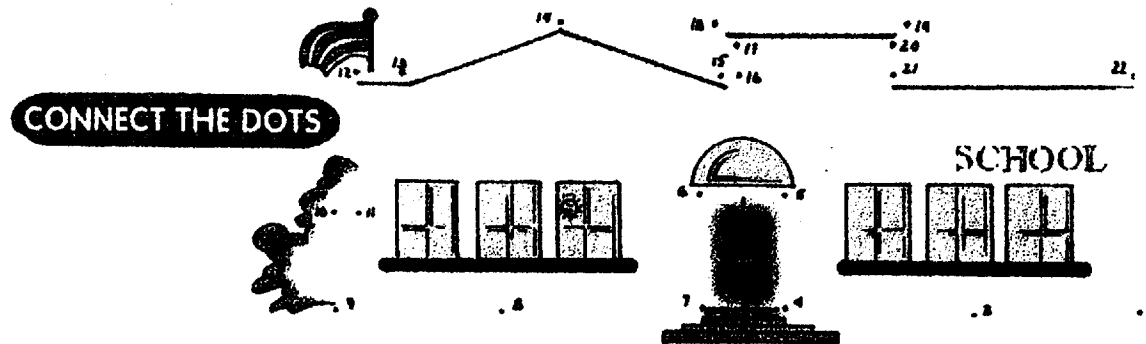
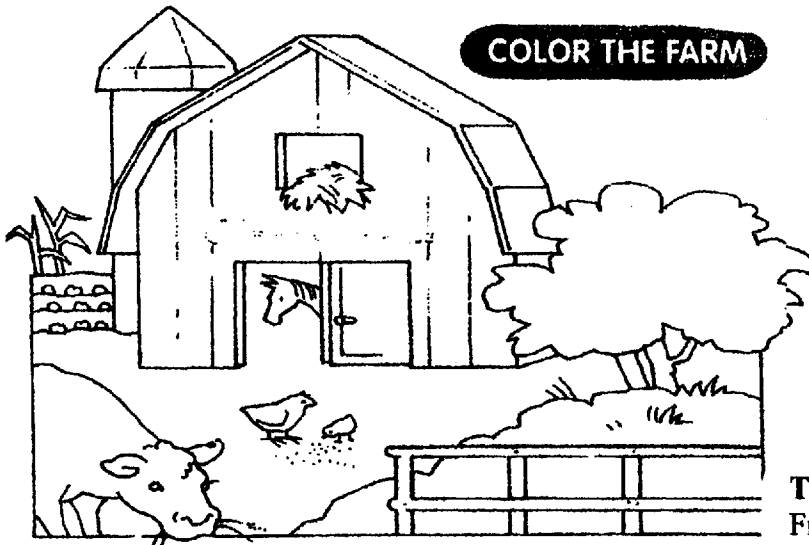


WILL YOU STILL WANT TO LIVE HERE IN 20 YEARS?



THINK FARMS ARE DISAPPEARING?

From 1992 to 1997, more than 29,351 Acres or 14% of farmland in Jackson County have gone out of active production. That's a rate of 5,870 acres per year.



SPENDING YOUR LIFE IN THE CAR?

94% of the County's work force commutes to work. The average drive can take a short fifteen minutes to a long two hours. While 2.2% walk and 3% work at home.



ARE YOU READY TO SHOP TILL YOU DROP?

From 1989 to 1999, the average median household income for Jackson residents grew from \$31,000 to \$43,171.

MOVING TO A QUIET AND SAFE PLACE?

From 1990 to 2000, population increased in Henrietta 17%, in Rives 18%, and in Waterloo 6% but decreased 3% in the City of Jackson.

THE JOB OF YOUR DREAMS.
From 1990 to 2000 Jackson County's employment in Manufacturing, Trades, and Agriculture have decreased an average of 4% while jobs in health, education, entertainment, and food service have increased an average of 9%.
